



At the Council meeting on 23 February 2006, Councillor Blencowe had moved, and Councillor Durrant had seconded the motion set out below. On a show of hands, under paragraph 13.8.1 of the Council Procedure Rules, it had been agreed, by 23 votes to 10 not to deal with the motion at that meeting. As a result, the motion stood referred to the Strategy Scrutiny Committee and Leader (not the Executive Councillor for Housing).

“This Council requests the Executive Councillor for Housing and Health to use all housing development land in the Council’s ownership, including Clay Farm, solely for affordable social housing.”

8 TO CONSIDER THE FOLLOWING NOTICES OF MOTION, NOTICE OF WHICH HAS BEEN GIVEN BY:

(a) Councillors Herbert and Newbold

This Council welcomes the increased enforcement powers in the 2005 Clean Neighbourhoods and Environment Act including clear powers to deal with abandoned shopping trolleys, an effective means of dealing with a problem which has such harmful effect on the streets of Cambridge.

It therefore calls upon officers to prepare a report as a matter of urgency for consideration by the Executive Councillor for Environmental Services, setting out how these powers could be used and the process for their adoption.

(b) Councillor Herbert

The Council recognises the critical and urgent need to tackle both pollution hotspots in Cambridge and to reduce climate change impacts caused in Cambridge.

It therefore calls upon Executive Councillors to report to the Environment Scrutiny Committee in November on

- current policies on tackling pollution hotspots and reducing climate change impacts, including initial proposals being considered for 2007/8

- the means by which a Committee of Inquiry can be established to develop an inclusive Cambridge Climate Change and Pollution Action Plan, through a process that will

- * engage key organisations and the public in addressing these issues
- * learn from best practice in comparable communities
- * determine what the council, other local organisations and the public can each best do to reduce their impacts
- * inform actions already underway by the council and others, including measures with net nil cost, and
- * assist further proposals to be costed and considered by the council and others as part of planning and budgets for future years.

(c) Councillors Hipkin and Dryden

This Council authorises the Mayor for the time being to continue the City's membership of the "Mayors for Peace" organisation for their term of office.
