<b>Matter for Decision:</b>	This project appraisal proposed the installation of a multi use games area at Nightingale Avenue Recreation Ground.		
<b>Why the decision had to be made (and any alternative options):</b>	The Council's Open Space and Recreation Strategy sets out standards for the provision of suitable facilities for older children and teenagers which this proposal meets. In light of the consultation that has taken place, including acknowledgment of the views of some nearby residents, the view of officers is that the installation of a multi use games area is an appropriate and justifiable provision.		
<b>The Executive Councillor's decision(s):</b>	To approve the construction of a multi use games area on Nightingale Avenue Recreation Ground and the additional funding request from S106 resources of £20,000, as noted in the officers' project appraisal, subject to further independent consultation with young people to verify that a multi use games area is the most appropriate facility to meet the needs of young people in the area. Also to carry out further independent consultation with local residents to identify their specific concerns in relation to provision of this type.
