Matter for Decision: to issue a tender for and to let a contract for the supply of tyres and related services for Council owned vehicles for a maximum period of 5 years from January 1st 2008 to December 31st 2013.

Why the decision had to be made (and any alternative options): A contract had been in place for the supply of tyres for the last five years. However, this contract covered vehicles only. The contract expired at the end of March 2007. The Council therefore needs to let another contract for the supply of tyres for Council owned vehicles and plant and equipment.

Matter for Decision: To agree the extension to this capital scheme (which is not included in the Council's Capital Plan) for approval by Council, subject to resources being available to fund the capital of £95,000 from reserves.

Why the decision had to be made (and any alternative options):

One of the major reasons for the need to replace these facilities is the deterioration caused by persistent and targeted misuse and abuse they have been subjected to over recent years. Whilst good practice in design and the use of modern materials can contribute to creating a facility that people feel safe and confident to use, having a presence at the site would have a significant benefit. The toilets have been moved to be adjacent to the street, which has created the opportunity to use existing footings to build a room to let.

The only alternative considered was not to build the extension.
