**Notice of Determination of Application for a Variation of Premises Licence

Cambridge City Council, being the licensing authority, on the 30th June 2008 received an application for a variation of the premises licence in respect of premises known as Nusha, Unit G6, Clifton Way Cambridge .

Representations were received from Inspector Porter of the Cambridgeshire Constabulary

On the 18th August 2008, a hearing was held to consider the representations.

In reaching the decision on the application, the Sub-Committee considered the material presented at the hearing both orally and in writing from Inspector Porter of the Cambridgeshire Constabulary and Richard Perks Counsel for the Police, The Applicant, Harriet Wells the Applicant's Counsel, Mr S. Harrow representing the Pubwatch and CMBAC schemes, Mr K Smith the Cambridge Leisure Centre Manager, and Mssrs S Howlett and T Harold representing security at the Centre, the representations made by the Responsible Authority, the Council's Statement of Licensing Policy and in particular the Cumulative Impact Policy, and the statutory guidance under the Licensing Act 2003.

In this case, the Sub-Committee had to balance the interests of the applicant with those of the wider community. The decision was reached on its individual merits noting the evidence about noise nuisance and crime records in the vicinity of the premises. The Sub-Committee also considered the measures proposed by the applicant in the operating schedule, proposed as additional conditions in support of the licensing objectives, and found that the applicant had successfully rebutted the presumption that the variations as amended by the subcommittee would add to the existing cumulative impact and had demonstrated that no negative cumulative impact would be caused.
