

## **NORTH AREA Recommendations for New S106 Projects**

### **1.0 Background**

The 'Improve your Neighbourhood' scheme has been developed by Active Communities as a process to allow new recreation and open space project ideas to be developed. Anyone can submit ideas for schemes that they would like to see happen in their area.

New project ideas are subject to a scoring process by these sections to ensure that they fulfill a minimum 30% of the required criterion-

- Green Spaces / Nature Conservation
- Recreation Services / Sports Development Service
- Landscape Architects / Safer Communities
- Children & Young People Participation Service

If projects are approved as potentially viable through Area Committee, they are added to a project list and presented to Scrutiny Committee. If adopted through this process they are then subject to full consultation.

### **2.0 Project Recommendations**

Ward Councilors are asked to approve recommendations for potential new projects in their Area & Citywide.

#### **NORTH AREA Project Recommendations.**

1	Dedicated Special Needs Play Area - Chesterton Area. Very little disabled play provision within the city
2	Woodhead Drive - Improved disabled access and refurbishment
3	Cameron Road Play area refurbishments
4	Improved recreation provision for young people on Nunns Way
5	Chestnut Grove Play area refurbishment
6	More/better seating around pavilion and in play area Nunns Way
7	Better lighting Nunns Way

#### **CITYWIDE Project Recommendations.**

1	Kelsey Kerridge Refurbish Climbing Wall & build new bouldering wall
2	Jesus Green Path works / to main London Plane Ave
3	Christ Pieces - creation of winter garden along Pikes Walk
4	Second full-size floodlit all weather pitch at the University Sports Complex at Wilberforce Road/ access for public use
5	Nest boxes scheme / Identify suitable council owned buildings for boxes
6	Bee Friendly Wildlife Areas
7	Demonstration Wildlife Garden / to show how to plant one

**NORTH AREA & CITYWIDE Project ideas scoring below minimum criteria & not recommended for inclusion.**

1	More Bins around the pavilion Nunns Way	Fails to meet minimum criterion but would be covered by s106 funding.
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**NORTH AREA & CITYWIDE Project ideas not eligible for s106 funding.**

**\*These submitted projects are not eligible for s106 funding as advised by the Planning & Obligations Team. They may however be suitable for other funding sources such as environmental improvement.**

1	Bird boxes & seating area - St Luke's School, French's Road	Would not be covered by s106 funding.
2	City business / college biodiversity challenge.	Fails to meet minimum criterion & would not be covered by s106 funding.
3	The Round Church The reinstatement of the railings around the perimeter wall.	Fails to meet minimum criterion & would not be covered by s106 funding.
4	Hundred Houses Junior wardens' scheme around Scotland road, work with young children helping them become responsible citizens	No contributions currently collected for this type of activity.
5	Nuns Way repaint pavilion shutters.	Not covered by s106 funding as it is a maintenance cost.
6	Growing spaces for children and young people, with the support of the community, to grow vegetables.	Not covered by s106 funding
7	Slipways in various parts of the riverbank for canoeists	Not covered by s106 funding.
8	Coe Fen near the Iron bridge, an area in need of attention. A folly and a brick boat shed.	Not covered by s106 funding.
9	Biodiversity on allotments project/ increase native planting, beetle banks, pond, promote wildlife	No contributions available for Nature Conservation.
10	Street Furniture Review	Not covered by s106 funding.
