Apologies were received from Councillors Benstead, and J Smith.

04/m/02 **DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST**

Councillor R Smith declared a personal interest in 04/m/07 as the applicant was an ex-student of his.

04/m/03 **PUBLIC ENTERTAINMENT LICENCE: NEXT GENERATION CLUB**

The Environmental Protection Manager updated the committee by saying that the details of the proposed layout of the premises had now been received from the applicant but that the recommendation to defer should stand.

The Chair asked for clarification of the details of the information received from Councillor Downham as mentioned in paragraph 5.2 of the report.

The Environmental Protection Manager stated that the estate mentioned was 300 metres from the premises and that only the residents of those properties within 50 metres were consulted. A full report and a map of the location would be provided at the next meeting.

Resolved -

To defer the application.

04/m/04 **PUBLIC ENTERTAINMENT LICENCE: HOGSHEAD**

The Environmental Protection Manager informed the committee that the application had been withdrawn by the applicant.

04/m/05 **PUBLIC ENTERTAINMENT LICENCE: JENNY WREN PUBLIC HOUSE**

In introducing the report, the Environmental Protection Officer said that 3 events had been held under an initial licence granted in October 2003. There had been unsatisfactory levels of noise and he recommended that only one event be licensed to enable the design for a scheme of sound insulation for the building to be prepared and approved. A further event could then be held following implementation of the approved scheme so that its effectiveness could be demonstrated (see condition 1 below).

The Fire Officer said that 2 concrete posts would be required at the entrance to prevent cars blocking it.

Resolved -

Approved subject to the following conditions:

1. One event only may be held, to enable the design of a scheme of sound insulation for the building to be prepared and approved by HEHWS. A further event may be held, following implementation of the approved scheme, to enable its effectiveness to be demonstrated.
2. 7 days notice of both events permitted by this licence shall be given to HEHWS.
3. Events to be held during pub hours only. (ie finish by 11 p.m.)
4. All doors and windows to venue to be kept closed during public entertainment events.
5. Maximum numbers dancing – 125
6. Number of exits – 3, to remain unobstructed during events.
7. Fire fighting equipment – 2 x 9l water extinguishers, behind bar, 1 x 2kg CO2 type extinguisher adjacent to band/disco.
8. Emergency lighting: Maintained illuminated “fire exit” notice (above each exit). Three in all.
9. One steward to be present.

04/m/06 **PUBLIC ENTERTAINMENT LICENCE: LIGHT**

Resolved –

Refused variation of the public entertainment licence to extend the finishing hours on any night, because of the likelihood of unreasonable disturbance to local residents.
