The minutes of the meeting held on 1 July were confirmed as a correct record and signed by the Chair.

04/m/70 **APOLOGIES**

Apologies for absence had been received from Councillor Benstead.

04/m/71 **DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST**

Councillor Dixon declared a personal interest in minute number 04/m/73 as his daughter lives in St Peter's Street.

Councillor Downham declared a personal interest in minute number 04/m/74 as she had been an objector when the application was considered at the last meeting.

04/m/72 **PUBLIC ENTERTAINMENT LICENCE (NEW) – BARON OF BEEF,
BRIDGE STREET**

The Environmental Protection Manager said that the applicants had now withdrawn the application.

04/m/73 **PUBLIC ENTERTAINMENT LICENCE (NEW) – COUNTY ARMS,
CASTLE STREET**

An objector was present and addressed the committee.

In introducing the report, the Environmental Protection Manager requested that the Committee agree that, on receipt of the electrical certificate, the licence be approved under delegated powers. The Committee agreed to this additional condition.

Resolved:

To permit three events, subject to the following conditions:

1. Hours to be Wednesday 8.30pm to 11pm, Sunday 8.30pm to 10.30pm
2. Seven days written notice of each event shall be given to HEHWS
3. Doors and windows shall be kept shut during performances
4. Numbers: seated/standing 100

5. Number of exits – 2
6. Fire fighting equipment: 1 x 9 litre foam (AFFF) extinguisher, behind bar.
7. Emergency lighting: Two maintained exit signs.
8. One steward to be present.
9. On receipt of the electrical certificate, the licence be approved under delegated powers.

Officers also agreed to check with the Highways Authority and the Planning Department that the tables placed on the public highway had the relevant permissions.

04/m/74 **PUBLIC ENTERTAINMENT LICENCE (RENEWAL): NEXT GENERATION, CAMBRIDGE LAKES**

Resolved:

To approve until 16 December 2004, subject to the following conditions

1. Hours Monday to Thursday 10am until midnight, Friday to Saturday 10am until 1am, Sunday noon until 12.30am.
2. Numbers – Main Lounge 200 Ground Floor, Function Suite 200 First floor
3. Exits – Main Lounge 3 ground floor, Function Suite 3 first floor.
4. Fire fighting equipment – 2 x 9 l water & 1 x 2KG CO2 extinguisher adjacent to any band/disco in Main Lounge and in Function Suite.
5. Emergency Lighting – Maintained illuminated fire exit notices one above each exit in Main Lounge and Function Suite.
6. Seven days written prior notice of each event or alternatively a programme listing the events to be supplied to the HEHWS.
7. Doors and windows in the licensed areas to be kept shut during events.
8. One Steward to be present in each area.
9. HEHWS may renew the licence after the 16 December 2004, in the absence of problems.

04/m/75 **PUBLIC ENTERTAINMENT LICENCE (RENEWAL): PURE, REGENT STREET**

The applicant was present and addressed the Committee.

The Fire Officer said that if the noise insulation scheme would affect the means of escape in the event of a fire, then the scheme needed to be approved by the Fire & Rescue Service.

Resolved:

- 1 Events may finish at 1.00am until 31st August, provided a noise limiter is installed by that date. If a noise limiter is not in place by 31st August 2004, then events shall finish at 11pm until such time as a noise limiter is installed and working to the satisfaction of the HEHWS.
- 2 A detailed scheme of noise insulation shall be submitted for approval by

- HEHWS, by the 31st August 2004.
- 3 The agreed scheme of noise insulation shall be installed and tested by the 30th November 2004. A noise insulation scheme installation completion report shall be submitted for approval by the HEHWS.
 - 4 All external doors and external windows to be kept shut at all times during performances, apart from the main entrance / exit door that allows general ingress and egress which shall be kept closed so far as reasonably practicable during events.
 - 5 The external seating / tables that are outside the premises on Regent Street shall not to be used during performances and shall be removed from the street.
 - 6 Once all works agreed under conditions 1 & 2 above have been satisfactorily completed, the HEHWS is delegated the authority to permit events to continue until 1.00 a.m.
 - 7 Should all works agreed under conditions 1 & 2 above not be satisfactorily completed, the application to be re-considered at the 16th December 2004 meeting of the Committee.

04/m/76 **PUBLIC ENTERTAINMENT LICENCE (RENEWAL): FIVE BELLS,
HIGH STREET, CHERRY HINTON**

The Environmental Protection Manager said that as progress had been made with providing appropriate sound insulation, the recommendation was now to approve.

Resolved:

To approve, until 16th December 2004, subject to the following conditions:

1. No more than one event to be held per week, on a night to be notified by the applicant to HEHWS.
2. Events may be held between 7.30pm and 11.00pm Monday – Saturday (or 7.30pm and 10.30pm on Sundays if the applicant opts for Sundays under 1. above)
3. Doors and windows must remain shut during entertainment events.
4. A scheme for the second phase of sound insulation of the building must be submitted to HEHWS within by 31st August 2004 for agreement. The agreed scheme must be implemented, in full, within a further two months (ie by 31st October 2004)
5. Until the scheme of insulation required under 4. above has been completed, no amplified bands shall be permitted.
6. Numbers admitted: 75
7. No of exits: 3
8. Fire fighting equipment: 1 x 9 litre water extinguisher, behind the bar; 1 x 2kg CO2 extinguisher, adjacent to disco / band
9. Maintained illuminated fire exit notices above each exit
10. One steward to be present
11. Once the second phase of the insulation work has been completed, HEHWS be delegated to approve the continuation of the licence, providing that there are no

problems and that, in the event of problems being identified, either with the insulation scheme or with complaints from residents, a report would be brought to committee on 16th December 2004, for determination.

04/m/77 **PUBLIC ENTERTAINMENT LICENCE (RENEWAL): CAMBRIDGE CITY FOOTBALL CLUB, MILTON ROAD**

The Environmental Protection Manager introduced the report and said that there were no concerns following the period of monitoring.

Resolved:

To approve 60 events per year, subject to the following conditions:

1. Events to be held Monday to Saturday from 7.30pm and shall finish by midnight.
2. All external fire exit doors and external windows to be kept shut at all times during performances. The main entrance / exit door that allows general ingress and egress shall be kept closed so far as reasonably practicable during events
3. Numbers admitted: 125
4. One steward to be present
5. Number of exits: 2
6. Fire fighting equipment:
 - a. 1 x 9L water extinguisher, behind the bar
 - b. 1 x 2kg CO2 type extinguisher, adjacent to the band / disco
8. Maintained illuminated fire exit notices, one above each door and one above the final exit lobby door.

04/m/78 **PUBLIC ENTERTAINMENT LICENCE (VARIATION): PO NA NA FEZ CLUB, SIDNEY STREET/MARKET PASSAGE**

The applicant was present and addressed the Committee.

The Environmental Protection Manager clarified that the variation in hours applied for included a change of use from recorded music to live music so a trial period was recommended.

Resolved:

To approve an initial licence for one event per month on Sundays until 2am. Seven days written notice of each event shall be given to HEHWS. The officers would monitor these events and the application would be reconsidered at the 16th December 2004 meeting.

04/m/79 **DORMANT PUBLIC ENTERTAINMENT LICENCES**

Resolved:

That the licences of the Cambridge Arts Picture House, The Castle, BJ's Cellar Bar and HMV, Lion Yard would lapse with effect from 5 August 2004.
