The Licensing Officer informed the Subcommittee that the representation made by the Environmental Protection Manager had been withdrawn following agreement with the applicant on suitable conditions. The Licensing Officer was able to issue a licence under delegated authority and there was no longer a requirement for a hearing.

06/lic?/ Application for a new Premises licences: Raj Mahal, Barnwell Road**Present:** Mr Foysol Ahmed

The hearing: The Licensing Officer presented her report and outlined the application being made. Two representations attached at Appendix B have been received from interested parties. However following the applicant's amendment to the terms of the application the representations had been withdrawn by the interested parties. A representation had been received from Planning, but had subsequently been withdrawn

Councillors discussed the application in the light of those concerns and others that had been expressed by interested parties.

The Licensing Officer presented her report and outlined the application being made. One representation had been received from a Responsible Authority, Planning, attached at Appendix B. The proposed opening hours contravened the planning condition, which stipulated midnight, not the later hours applied for. The Licensing Officer said that, in these circumstances, the National Guidance directed that the earlier time should be adhered to.
