Sixty seven representations had been received from Interested Parties, sixty three representations had been received opposing the variation, attached at Appendix C. Representations included letters from the Glisson Road/Tenison Road Area Residents Association, Mawson Road, Perowne Street, Tenison Road, Covent Garden, Mill Road, Mill Street, Tenison Court, Mill Street, Emery Street, Lyndewode Road, Gwydir Street, St Barnabas Court, Glisson Road, Willis Road, Cross Street, Devonshire Road and Guest Road.

The applicant's solicitor and the applicant put the case for the variation of the licence and responded to questions from members of the subcommittee.

The Interested Parties present spoke in support of their representations and responded to questions from members of the subcommittee

The Decision: In reaching the decision on the variation of the application the Subcommittee considered the material presented, the written representations made, the Council's Statement of Licensing Policy and the Statutory Guidance under the Licensing Act 2003.

Members noted the evidence of disruption that had occurred in the past and recognised the genuine concerns of the residents in the area. It was decided therefore to grant the application for variation in part.

Details of application:

The Chair informed the meeting of the decision reached by the Subcommittee and that all parties would receive written notification of the decision. She said that interested parties retained their right to apply for a review of the licence. She encouraged residents to keep in contact with the Environmental Health Service and report specific complaints.
