There were a number of key issues raised by the consultees during this time. A summary of these is given below and how they were dealt with in the adjacent column:

Issue Raised	How it was dealt with
The scope of the document	It was agreed that as full a range as possible of sustainable design and construction issues should be included, for example adaptation to climate change, although this would add to the length of the document.
The range of issues that should be included, including sustainable urban design and historic environment	New sections were inserted on these topics.
The inclusion of the proposed Air Quality SPD within this SPD	This was incorporated.
Comments on the user-friendliness of the document and level of detail	This was debated and each section was made as concise as possible, with the aim of not compromising on the quality of the guidance provided.
Feedback on the use of a checklist	It was decided this was the best approach and the content was reviewed by all
Feedback on the concept of essential and preferred standards	It was decided that these would be linked directly to local plan policies
The need for the document to flag up need for sustainability considerations to be considered in parallel with other design considerations	Section 6 on 'Achieving Sustainability' was drafted to try and address this issue

The draft SPD and its accompanying sustainability appraisal are due to go for public consultation for 4 weeks from 17th January 2007 until 14th February 2007.
