3.What is the name, email and position of the senior Council officers responsible for this service.

4. Which executive Councillor is responsible for the licensing service.

## Response

On the 26th April 2021, the Environmental Health Department moved to a new IT system. Due to the change of system, our previous public register platform was no longer compatible, and meant it was no longer accessible. We are currently in the process of launching the new Public register platform, however this is taking us longer than originally planned. We are working hard and continuously to ensure the online public register is available online again as soon possible. We hope to have it up and running by end of the year, however it is dependent on a number of factors.

In the meantime, although our previous licence register is currently unavailable, members of the public are able to find out any information that would be available via the licence register by completing an 'contact us with a licensing enquiry' form which is available online or e-mailing us at <u>licensing@cambridge.gov.uk</u>.

Following a request, information is provided. To ensure those visiting our licence application pages, such as the <u>Current alcohol and entertainment licence</u>

<u>applications</u> – page, are aware that the licence register is not available and the process to follow, we have maintained a banner containing the contact details to <u>licensing@cambridege.gov.uk</u> at the top of these pages.
