

MARLEIGH BUS SERVICE UPDATE

Confirmation has been received from Amber Bez (Network Development Planner for the Cambridgeshire and Peterborough Combined Authority - CPCA) that over £330,000 for the Marleigh neighbourhood received from Section 106 planning obligations has been transferred to the CPCA. Following on from requests by residents at the previous Cambridge East Community Forum, the issue of bus service provision has also been raised directly with CPCA Network Managers.

Discussions are underway regarding the most appropriate transport solution for this area. Approval to spend the funding was considered at the 17 June 2026 meeting of the CPCA Transport Committee – further details can be found here: [Agenda for Transport Committee on Wednesday, 17th June, 2026, 10.00 am](#)

The funding includes an additional future funding of £26,500, which combined presents an opportunity to enhance existing bus services (rather than the more costly provision of new services). Strengthening routes such as the T5 or PR2 are promising options, subject to further public consultation and design considerations.

In June 2026, the CPCA launched a public consultation on draft proposals for improving bus routes across the City and District.
