New activities, clubs and societies

Since first new resident in 2012:

- Trumpington Meadows community group set up
- Abode residents community created an active network
- Trumpington Residents Association expanded
- 4 x local Facebook networks set up led by local residents
- 10 x new fitness groups
- 8 x new lifestyle / hobby groups
- 3 x new kids sports clubs opened
- New uniformed youth activities: Beavers, Cubs and Guides



The Community Chest

Small pots of funding **up to £250** available to kick-start community projects in and around the new communities

- 42 successfully funded projects
- Funds available for up to 36 new projects
