

# Residents' Association Grant

## Up to £1,000 for your Residents' Association

Are there problems in your estate or neighbourhood that never seem to get fixed? Why not form a Residents' Association? You'll be able to get things done more quickly as a group and you could receive a grant from the Council to help fund your activities and projects.

A Residents' Association is a group of local people, who meet up and work to improve life for everyone in their area. A Residents' Association can help you to:

- Get funding from the Council
- Clear up crime and anti-social behaviour
- Get street and home repairs tackled
- Distribute newsletters to keep residents informed

### Who Can Apply?

If you live in an area where at least a third of homes are Council properties, then you could receive a grant of up to £1,000 from the Council to run your Residents' Association.

### What are the Rules?

If you want to get a Council grant to pay for your running costs, there are some requirements. You must have a 'Constitution', which

is a document that states the aims of your group. The Council has a standard constitution template which you can use – you just have to fill in the names and places specific to your group.

Your group will also need to have a bank, building society or credit union account, with at least 2 signatories for signing cheques.

A Residents' Association would normally include

a Chair, Secretary and Treasurer. The Chair normally runs the meetings, the Secretary is in charge of paperwork like invitations, minutes and newsletters, and the Treasurer is in charge of looking after the money and making sure it is spent correctly.

These are not formal roles like jobs, and the Council can help train you in any of the above if you think you'd need help.
