The Market Square project started in November 2018 and the initial funding of £100K was authorised at committee in February 2018:

The Market Square project budget proposal was presented to Full Council on 22 Feb 2018 (**ref. item 18/9/CNLa**), as part of the Council's Budget Setting Report (BSR) 2018/19 v3 (February 2018/19) – ref. Appendix [C(a)], p58 of 117. The corresponding minute (18/15/CNL) for this item was approved at Full Council on 19 April 2018. An additional bid was made in the budget setting round for 2020/21 for £30K once we became aware we had insufficient budget to start Stage 2 of the project. The project will be undertaken in two stages: stage 1 (feasibility assessment and preliminary costings) in 2018/19, to determine whether or not the project is financially

viable, before proceeding to stage 2 (detailed design and associated capital investment plan) in 2019/20. The results from stages 1 and 2 will be used to support a planning application for the proposed project and to secure any additional capital and revenue resources required to support its ongoing development and delivery.
