

**(CCC) Brexit**

Thank you for your request for information regarding Cambridge City Council's preparations for Brexit, received by the Council on 17<sup>th</sup> September 2020.

- 1. The No-deal Brexit risk register; and documents on any contingency planning for leaving the end of the transition periods without an EU-UK free trade deal?**

I attach Cambridge City Council's Brexit risk register. This document contains the information that Cambridge City Council holds with regard to this request.

- 2. Are you planning to stockpile goods in preparation for the end of the post Brexit transition period, and what are you planning to stockpile?**

As far as I am aware, Cambridge City Council is not currently stockpiling goods in preparation for the end of the post Brexit transition period.

As part of risk management during the run up to the UK's departure from the EU, the City Council hired a fuel storage tank and filled it with fuel, to ensure that council services could continue to be delivered if there were any disruption to fuel supplies. Council officers are continuing to monitor Brexit risks, and if it became appropriate, may consider continuing/resuming this arrangement, to mitigate that risk.

The Greater Cambridge Shared Waste Service (which is managed and hosted by South Cambridgeshire District Council on behalf of both Cambridge City and South Cambridgeshire) is also holding reserves of fuel.

- 3. How have you spent the extra money allocated by the government for Brexit and transition period preparations?**

The cost of installing and hiring the fuel tank mentioned in response to your question 2 is the only expense recorded against that funding to date. The installation cost £6,600 and the hire £11,500 to the end of September.
