Summary : (CCC) Rough Sleepers

During the recent "Everyone In" scheme, local authorities in the UK were required to house rough sleepers through funding provided by central government during Coronavirus National Lockdown Restrictions (2020). I am enquiring about the months that followed as detailed below. Please can you send me information for each of the following points?

1. How many rough sleepers in your local authority area were accommodated in total between August-October 2020?

96 individuals who were previously rough sleeping were accommodated at some time during the period 1st August and 31st October 2020, either under statutory duties or under the 'Everyone In' strategy.

2. How many rough sleepers in your local authority area accommodated under the "Everyone In" initiative in total between August-October 2020?

86 of these individuals were accommodated due to COVID-19 under the 'Everyone In' strategy

3. How many rough sleepers in your local authority area, who were accommodated under the "Everyone In" scheme (March-July 2020) continued to be provided accommodation in the months August-October 2020?

66 individuals who were accommodated under the 'Everyone In' strategy before the end of July 2020 were still accommodated on that basis after 1st August 2020.

4. How many of the rough sleepers accommodated at any time during this period (August- October) are considered to be No Recourse to Public Funds (NRPF)?
18 individuals accommodated at some time during the period 1st August and 31st October 2020 are known to be foreign nationals. The Council is working with all individuals that may not currently have recourse to public funds to bring them into eligibility, where possible – so the situation is constantly changing.

5. How many of the rough sleepers accommodated at any time during this period (August-October) are EU nationals?

16 individuals accommodated at some time during the period 1st August and 31st October 2020 are known to be EU nationals

6. Have any rough sleepers placed in accommodation during this time been supported through a reconnection service to another part of the UK or to return to country of origin as well as information on the age, gender, nationality and marital status of those who have subsequently accessed a reconnection service.

We have taken your question to mean rough sleepers beginning a placement in accommodation between August 1st and 31st October 2020, and ending their placement due to being reconnected.

On this basis, there were no individuals who were placed in accommodation during the period, and have subsequently been reconnected.

If you intended to mean individuals who were already in accommodation at the start of the subject period, and who have subsequently been reconnected, there were 6, broken down on the attached report. We do not routinely record marital status.
