# BDW2 Carbon Reduction Strategy / future low energy home heating

- Residents questions around solar panel numbers installed and how affects Building Regs part L.
- Planning conditions 21/044312/REM require post construction certificates (c.11) and proof of future adaptability for efficient electric (c.12).
- DWH state all bar 10 plots on BDW2 built to 2021 standards, with more energy efficient materials used in build. This allows for lesser solar panels to reach the 2021 standard. Other certification will be provided to the LPA demonstrating exceedance of 2021 standards.
- Homes should have adaptable radiators to run with heat pump; suitable external heat pump unit space; installed ready hot water tank & pipework between pump & hot water tank.



# Woodlark Road Drainage Ditch

# BDW5/6 Franklin Gardens

Question raised about any interim on street parking restrictions – planning conditions approved details for interim visitor bays but no private enforcement regime as seen on other parcels. LPA would like to see uniformity.

24/00961/NMA1 application in for Plots 202 To 205 And 209 to change the 1.8m high wire mesh fence to the eastern and southern boundary to a 1.8m close board fence. Potential landscaping and security issues to consider.

# Questions submitted



- 1. Several houses on BDW2 already have water damage to the new brick work.
- 2. No footpath along the BDW / Woodlark Rd boundary fence – site levels still to be checked against plans.
- 3. No information about when, where and for how long visitors can park on site - only penalty notices.
- 4. There is already standing water on the playing fields and footpaths.
- 5. Difficult to find information about when the library or allotments are opening.
- 6. A full Swale alongside the Darwin Green Playing field.

# Planning matters: Outline Application



A new Outline Planning Application has been submitted for the future phases of development.

- 3,800 **homes**, bringing the total to an estimated 5,650 homes
- Up to 50% **affordable housing** for University key workers
- 1,675 **student accommodation**, bringing the total to 2,000
- Over one third **green, open spaces**
- New **pedestrian and cycle** routes
- Sports and play facilities
- 100,000m<sup>2</sup> of **employment space**, 60% of which will be used for research and innovation, and 40% focused on mid-tech uses.





## REPORT TEDDINGTON

Teddington is a low-cost community event supporting Eddington families with social connection, toys, and a spacious, welcoming environment. It is attended by over 20 families each quarter, with support from the Eddington Residents Association, who created a simple card-payment system.

**Social Cohesion:** With four in five parents experiencing isolation (YouGov 2024), Teddington offers an essential space for parents and guardians to meet, share experiences, and build friendships, while children develop social and play skills.

**Place-Making:** Storey's Field Centre provides a safe, friendly venue with storage and room to grow. Most families live locally and walk to the Centre, and they consistently rate the space highly. As children grow, families often join other Centre activities.

**Community Well-Being:** The weekly baby and toddler group is highly valued for its regular play opportunities, friendships, shared knowledge, and supportive relationships, contributing to the well-being of both children and caregivers.






