Holiday Activities and Food Programme

The Cambridgeshire Holiday Activities and Food (HAF) Programme, run by Cambridgeshire County Council, offers fully funded holiday places for eligible school-age children during Easter, summer and Christmas (subject to availability).

For summer 2026 (21 July to 28 August), children can book up to 64 hours of fun activities, with a healthy meal and snacks included.

Free holiday lunches

During the school holidays, the average food bill can increase by 40%, which can place pressure on families.

The holiday lunch network is supported by Cambridge City Council and Cambridge Sustainable Food.

Support for Families

We know the school holidays can be a difficult time financially. If you're worried about money, help is available across Cambridge.

You may be able to access benefits, housing support, or emergency payments if you're struggling with rent or household costs.

Free advice is also available to help you manage your budget, reduce bills and deal with debt, including support from organisations like Citizens Advice.

You might also qualify for Council Tax discounts, energy grants, or home improvement funding to help reduce expenses.
